CARE STANDARDS TRAINING



Congratulations to *Grindle* (Senior Nurse) for completing her Supporting Student in Practice and Train the Trainer courses! She is now the official in-house trainer of Meadowcare and Glenview Homes! She is set to deliver the 15 Care Standards trainings that has started this year.

EMPATHETIC TRAINING
